

Grace-Gifted, Faith-Lifted Called to Share, Seek, and Serve Christ Dear Friends in Christ,

"This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it" (Psalm 118:24). For the last two weekends, the psalmist has declared these words in the midst of our worship. While I continue to



pray that God will grant us elongated spans of time with warmer weather, even with the chill, there have been many reasons to rejoice in these days that the Lord made as we enter into the spring and summer seasons and complete another program year.

Throughout the pages of this Ambassador, you will find pictures and stories of the ways in which we have been celebrating in these days. We completed our celebration of Lent with the conclusion of our Lenten drama "The People Versus Jesus of Nazareth." We celebrated Holy Week and Easter with much fanfare and many people participating in our worship services and behind the scenes to make each service meaningful throughout the week. It was a beautiful sight to see so many people worshiping together again, with over three hundred people in the building for Easter Sunday. We were able to celebrate with breakfast together and our children enjoyed running around the yard finding all of the Easter eggs that the high school youth had filled for them. These were surely days that the Lord had made and we rejoiced in each and every one of them.

To prepare for our Easter celebration, an amazing work crew got together on April 9 to make the church sparkle for our time of rejoicing. Despite the wind that made so much of the work more difficult, the sun was bright and shining, and we rejoiced in the beauty of this space we call home. That same day, our high school youth rejoiced (at least most of the day) as they worked together to make the most cinnamon rolls we have ever made, and we rejoiced in all those who purchased the rolls to support our mission trip. Again, this was a day that the Lord had made in which we were able to rejoice.

This last weekend, we rejoiced with our eighth grade Confirmation youth as they prepared for and affirmed their baptism. We were able to celebrate with their families at a dinner in the Fellowship Hall on Wednesday, April 20, we celebrated as nine of them

affirmed their faith on Sunday, April 24, and we will rejoice with two more of them on Saturday, May 7, as they affirm their faith. After a crazy two years of Confirmation Conversations, these celebrations were and will be days that the Lord has made in which rejoicing is the natural response.

There is also so much more ahead as we prepare to celebrate baptisms and recognize our graduating seniors, as we move into a summer schedule of worship and prepare to worship outdoors every other Sunday beginning in June. We are looking forward to celebrating Compassion Sunday as we give thanks for the ways that we support our Denisse and John. We look forward to our Final Friday celebration with the children in the North Scott District, and for our "Shake It Up Café" VBS coming in July. All of these and more will be days that the Lord has made in which we will all rejoice together.

We are also inviting you into our dreaming of ways in which we can rejoice in all of the days ahead which the Lord will make for us. In this month of May, the Congregation Council invites you to join them for opportunities for fellowship and for dreaming of ways in which we can bring this joy of God's love into the world. The Council has identified four priorities for this year, which Mike Garner has spelled out for us on page four, and we invite you to come and help us to imagine the concrete ways in which we can live into those priorities in this year and into the years ahead. We will gather on Sundays, May 1, 15, and 22, immediately following the 9:00 am worship service, and on Saturday, May 7, immediately following the 5:00 pm worship service. There will be refreshments, conversation, and an activity for everyone to participate in, including children and youth, as we work together toward the future that God is creating for and with us, and we look forward to seeing you there.

As we give thanks for all of the days past and look to the days ahead, may we join the psalmist each day in proclaiming, "This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it." May we rejoice together in all that God is doing in and through each and all of us, this day and always.


