Dear Friends in Christ,

We have entered the season after Pentecost. This is the time in the church year when we learn what it means to follow Jesus beyond the festivals and pageantry of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter. The color for this season is green as this is a season for us to grow in our discipleship and our understanding of how it is that we follow Jesus. It is the longest season of the church year, perhaps because following Jesus in our daily lives is where we are called to center our lives.

Following Jesus means going out and inviting others into God's work with our hands as there are many who need to hear the promise of God's love for them and God's mission can always use more people on board as Jesus' disciples learn when Jesus sends them out to do Jesus' work. In the weeks ahead, we will be reminded that following Jesus means loving all of our neighbors, even those we do not like very much, and we will find encouragement in God's wide and welcoming arms, even when we totally break God's heart. In all of these stories and so many more throughout these twenty some weeks, I pray that we will all renew our commitment to following Jesus as we consider new ways to share the good news of God's love with others, even when it is not the easiest thing to do.

As Mike Garner has written in his report of Council on page 4, we are so glad for all of the ways that we have been able to reengage in God's mission and ministry, following Jesus' call to serve our neighbors. As a pastor, it is wonderful to see the hustle

and bustle around the building during Feed Our Children as we share God's love not only with those who receive the meals, but also with those who prepare the meals. It is also heartwarming to see new and different members of the congregation stepping into leadership for this ministry and to continue to see the ways that God provides exactly what we need when we need it through so many members of the community.

It is fun to sit and "solve all of the world's problems" during our Tuesday afternoon Bible study (even though it will be taking a hiatus for several weeks). We are looking forward to the energy of VBS in a couple of weeks as we share the love of Jesus at "Shake It Up Café". I am looking forward to my two favorite weeks of the year, which will be back-to-back this year as I get to spend quality time with our youth and adults at Lutheran Lakeside Camp and with our high school youth on our mission trip to Nashville, which has been a serious challenge to plan this year, but which promises to be a lot of fun. 




A Pastoral Invitation from Pastor Carrie

It is clear to me that the recent ruling of the Supreme Court on Dobbs vs. Jackson has deeply affected many people, including people in this very congregation. I do not intend to preach about the ruling itself or its impact on American law. Indeed,

there are many who would say that preachers should stay out of politics altogether. However, this is not possible. As Christians we are citizens both of God's kingdom, eternally, and of this nation, temporarily. Our faith affects the way we live, act, and even vote. It is necessary to distinguish, however, that Christian faith, while political, must never be partisan. To put it another way, if you ever find yourself believing that any particular political party has advanced a platform that is in full alignment with the gospel of Jesus Christ, you have created an idol. God does not tolerate divided worship.

Because this has deeply affected many people, we, as followers of Jesus Christ, need to pay attention, and we need to be willing to have conversations around these topics, allowing people to opt in and out of conversations that have such deep personal implications. Therefore, I make this invitation: if you need someone for a one-on-one conversation about this, my door is open. If you are interested in listening, praying, thinking, and talking -in that order- with other members of this congregation, let me know, and we will organize a group for such conversations.
