Grace-Gifted, Faith-Lifted Called to Share, Seek, and Serve Christ



Dear Friends in Christ,

It is hard to believe that we have already reached the month of October. School is in full swing. The temperatures have begun to take their downward turn. The harvest is beginning all around us. The signs that we are reaching the end of the year are becoming clear.

October also has been the time in the church when we traditionally consider the spiritual practice of stewardship. As the harvest comes in, and we are giving thanks to God for all of the gifts that God continues to provide for us, it is a good time to consider how it is that God is calling us to use our unique gifts together to continue to proclaim the good news of God in Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit within our congregation, the wider community, even around the world.

Therefore, during the first four weeks of October, I will be focusing my preaching around the theme, "Go Tell the World: 4 Traits of a Life of Stewardship." I will be making use of resources that have been provided from the Southeastern Iowa Synod, ELCA, and adapting those for our congregation as we consider the lectionary texts that are assigned for these first four weeks of October and the promises made in the rite of Affirmation of Baptism.

When we are confirmed or join this congregation, there are questions asked of each of us and of us as a congregation. These questions and responses are as follows:

Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

People of God, do you promise to support these sisters and brothers and pray for them in their life in Christ?

We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.

- from the rite of Affirmation of Baptism, ELW p. 236

From the waters of the font, children of God live in covenant with God and community. While the word 'stewardship' never once appears in

the baptismal promises, altogether these promises sum up what it is to be a steward: one who uses wisely the gifts God has given. It takes good stewardship to worship, proclaim, and do good works of service, justice and peacemaking on a daily basis for the duration of a life of faith, for there certainly is so much to be done. Without stewardship, it could be that gifts are squandered, go unused to share God's love with the world, are used and abused, or are spent so that the gift becomes a burden. But, as this rite reminds us, stewardship is not solely an individual endeavor. It also happens in community as the body of Christ builds one another up in truth and spurs one another toward love and good deeds.

Often, when we think of Stewardship, our minds turn directly to financial stewardship, and some of us get a little squeamish. We do not like to talk about money in worship. We do not want to be asked to give more. The truth is, Faith's financial situation is not strong at the moment. At the end of August, our expenses have outpaced our income by nearly \$20,000. We have returned to full programming at the pace of 2019, and expenses have increased in those years for the church just as they have in all of our lives. I assure you that the Congregation Council and Ministry Teams have been careful in their spending, and still, we find ourselves behind. If you are behind in your intended giving for this year or you have some extra to give toward God's ministry in this place, your giving would be a blessing to the people gathered here and to all whom we reach around the world.

Yet, while this is the reality for our congregation at this time, our focus on stewardship will not be solely, not even primarily, centered on financial stewardship. Instead, in these first four weeks of October, we will catch a glimpse of what it takes to steward a whole life of faith by examining four aspects of discipleship as it relates to life, money and community. We will explore faith, gratitude, persistence, and humility, all while naming and claiming the baptismal call to tell the world of God's love in Jesus Christ.

My prayer is that this will be just the beginning of the conversation about how we, as individuals and community can better steward the gifts God has entrusted to us. I believe that we have all we need to live into God's mission and to proclaim the good news of God's love to our neighbors and the world, and we steward those gifts with faith, gratitude, persistence and humility so that more people may come to know and be transformed by God's saving love.

As you enjoy the changes that fall brings, I invite you to join us for these conversations as we grow together in our practice of stewardship.



You need to be 'invited' to create an account to access this information. The church office will send an email invite on October 4 with a link to set up your account. Simply follow the instructions to get started.




Be sure to download the IconCMO app in the Google Play Store or the iOS Play Store. Once the app is downloaded, you can log in using the credentials you received from the church email.

looking forward to working with them again. The trip will be July 22-29, 2023.






