one who gave his very self to redeem us from our sins and give us the ultimate gift of eternal life, we are called to live in this hope and share that hope with others.



The Sanctuary Update team would like to share our progress for improvements with the congregation this month. We understand that it is not the right time to start the project as our current focus is to replace the roof, but we would like to share what we've been working on in hopes that we may be able Sanctuary Update Committee to execute this update in the next few years.

Our team began working four years ago to create a plan for improvements to the sanctuary. We held cottage meetings to hear the needs of our congregation, met with the Mission Investment Fund to learn about design possibilities and financial options, worked with Gunder Church Furniture to create designs for the updated space, and obtained bids for other key improvements such as electrical, flooring, and sound system.

The overall goal of the sanctuary update is to improve accessibility and functionality of the space so that all may have a comfortable worship experience. There are four key areas we are wanting to improve: 1) reconfigure the seating floor plan and altar area to allow for increased accessibility and flexibility, 2) incorporate technology into the space to enhance in-person and online worship, 3) update the sound system so that all can hear during worship, 4) refresh the aesthetic of the space while still keeping the Mid-Century Modern style.

The changes we are proposing would have an immediate benefit, not only for people who are elderly or impaired, but also families with children. We have carefully considered changes that will have longevity for our congregation. Looking to the future, having an updated space will also allow us to be equipped for worship opportunities not yet imagined.

We are currently estimating the project to cost \$150,000-\$250,000, recognizing that costs likely increase as more time passes. To reiterate, we are not asking for this funding right now, but would like to give transparency for the scope of the project. Our goal is to have the renovations started by 2025.

Our team will be presenting the design boards and highlighting the updates in our Annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday, January 29th. The boards will be set up in the gathering space two weeks prior, and team members will be available to discuss the update in the informational budget meeting that will be held January 22nd.

We look forward to sharing with you.

Summer Camp Registration is Here!!



Registration is now open for Lutheran Lakeside Camp this summer. We are planning to attend camp **July 16-21.** There is Junior Camp for those who have completed grades 3-5 and Confirmation Camp for those who have completed grades 6-8. How we will get to camp will be determined at a later date.

Summer Camp drop down menu for more information and the Camp Registration tab when you are ready to register. The total cost for a week at camp is \$475 for the first child. If you send more than one child from your household, there is a \$15 sibling discount for the second and subsequent children. A \$100 deposit is due at registration. There is an Early Bird Discount of \$50 for all those who register by February 28. As in years past, Faith will cover \$150 of the cost of camp per child (including friends that they might invite). Therefore, the out-of-pocket cost, if you register by February 28, would be \$275 for your first child and \$260 for any additional children from your household. Please only pay \$100 at the time of registration and be sure to let them know that you are going with Faith Lutheran Church so that they apply the \$150 campership appropriately. You can pay the remainder of the camp fees after the campership is applied. Also, please let Pastor Carrie know when you have registered so that she can make sure that the campership is applied and have an accurate count of who is planning to go to help with transportation plans.

Adults are invited to join us for the adult mission trip to do work around the camp that week as well, so if that is something that would interest you, please let Pastor Carrie know.


