

Grace-Gifted, Faith-Lifted Called to Share, Seek, and Serve Christ Dear Friends in Christ,

As I mentioned in my 2022 Annual Report, as I was going through pictures of our activities and events, worship and fellowship, community service and celebration, I was filled with excitement and hope as the energy that has been flowing through this place in recent months filled me again. It brought to mind one of my favorite verses from Isaiah:

I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert" (43:19)

God has always called us to be God's presence in this place, yet, how we have shared the love of Jesus has changed over the years. I can feel that shift happening again as new ministry ideas are beginning to emerge as we think about how we continue to be and share the love of Christ here at Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church. God is doing something new here, and we are beginning to perceive the new ways in the wilderness and rivers in the desert that God is creating in our midst.

The season of Lent, which we will enter at the end of the month, beginning with Ash Wednesday on February 22, will offer us an opportunity to do a couple of new things that God is opening us to. The first of these opportunities is to have a weekly meal provided on Wednesday evening. We know that we are all busy, and to add Lenten worship on Wednesday after an already busy day can be hard. It can be particularly hard when you need to feed yourself and your family before coming to worship. Thus, the Congregation Council has decided to provide a meal each Wednesday from 5:00 to 6:30 pm during Lent. On Ash Wednesday, we will have our annual soup supper where anyone can sign up to share their favorite soup or try something new, and the Confirmation youth will serve that meal. For the following five weeks, one of the ministry teams will serve the meal. We will share what will be served each week in the March Ambassador as well as on our Facebook page once all of the menus have been determined. A free

will offering will be accepted to help offset the cost of the meals. We hope that you will choose to join us for this meal and opportunity for fellowship, and then, you will join us for worship 7:00 pm.

The second of these new opportunities comes with these Lenten worship services. While we will continue to use *Holden Evening Prayer* as the basis for our worship, the message for these services will be conversational. Our theme for our Wednesday evening worship services will be *Ask*, and throughout Lent, we will ask and converse about questions of faith. After all, we all have questions about God and faith and our relationships with God and one another. Sometimes we are told that our questions are unfaithful and true faith requires certainty in all things. But what if faith requires us to ask questions? What if we need questions to survive and grow as a community of faith? What if relationship with God requires questions?

To be honest, if we read scripture carefully, we discover that questions are everywhere. There are hundreds of questions from the Garden of Eden to the very first words Jesus utters after the resurrection in the Gospel of John. Some of these questions are pesky. Some prefer to hide in the shadows and never be noticed. Some shout loudly, repeatedly, and beg attention. Some go with us to the grave. Once we start noticing the questions, we begin to see them everywhere. Like our biblical ancestors so long ago, we have plenty of questions that we carry, that we wish to share with others, to which we seek to find answers, even when the answers are far beyond us.

So each Wednesday in Lent, we will use one of the readings from the previous Sunday and dig deeper into the questions that surround the reading. We will offer opportunities to be in conversation with those whom you know well and those whom you might just be meeting. Our hope is that through asking our questions together, we will be able to grow in relationship with God and with one another in this Lenten season as we do something new together.

So we invite you to bring your family and friends on Wednesdays this Lent to join us for a meal, fellowship and worship as we ask faithful questions of God and one another as we grow our faith together.


Mark Your Calendars -Cheeseburger In Paradise Returns!





Midweek Lenten Worship

There are roughly 980 questions in the Greek New Testament along, and most of them occur in the gospels. That is a lot of questions. But why did the original writers of these most holy words write them as questions, when we so often

turn to scripture for answers?

That is one of the questions that we are hoping to explore during the Lenten season. The Sunday readings for this year are designed to invite us into wonder and curiosity, rather than into certainty. Because questions beg for relationship, exploring questions together will help us to build relationships with one another and with God.

Each Wednesday, during our Lenten Evening Prayer Service, we will focus on a question from one of the readings of the previous Sunday to explore together in conversation. The themes for each week and the scripture that will be used are:

Week One (March 1): Questions That Divide, Questions that Bind – Genesis 3:1-4, 6-11

Week Two (March 8): Simple Questions – John 3:1-9

Week Three (March 15): Questions For the Curious – John 4:7-11 Week Four (March 22): Questions That Change, Questions That Change You – John 9:1-3

Week Five (March 29): Questions That Kick – John 11:17-27

There will also be an accompanying daily devotion guide to help you engage various questions throughout the season – questions of scripture and questions of your own. Each day will offer an opportunity to read a couple of verses of scripture to zero in on the question for the day. A couple of additional questions are then added to help you to reflect on the scriptural question. A brief prayer is provided in the form of a question from you to God. There is an opportunity for practice which can include the whole family. And finally, it is encouraged that you create a question jar where, each day, each member of the family places a question or two into the jar. Then, on Sunday, rather than doing a devotion, you spend time as a family exploring the questions in the question jar together. Some questions may have easy and straightforward answers. Others may need some more research or may require conversation with a pastor or doctor or educator or Bible study colleague. Still others may simply be "God questions" that we cannot answer in this life. The hope is that these questions will help us to draw closer to God and one another during this Lenten season.

We hope that you will join us on this Lenten journey as we ask our questions together.

First Communion Milestone

Holy Communion is a gift from God! As with any gift that God gives, it is given with no strings attached. There is nothing we can do

that makes us more or less worthy of the gift. Yet—when you or your child receive a gift, it a natural to want to know all about the gift. What is it? How does it work? What do you do with it? These are some of the big questions we'll be learning about during the "First Communion Milestone".

Pastor Heather and Joni Schneider will be leading two important extended learning sessions on March 5th and March 26th from 10:15am-12:15pm. Any students second grade or above who has not received first communion is welcome to attend. During class each student will learn more about the gifts of Holy communion, they will create their own communion chalice (wine cup), participate in a mini-Seder meal, and learn how to make communion bread for worship. After completion of these two class sessions, students will be invited to receive their first communion at worship on Maundy Thursday, April 6 at 7 pm.

We need to know how many children are planning on attending so that we have supplies ready for your child. Please reply by March 1, 2023. Again, we look forward to growing in faith with your child this Lenten season.

6th graders: Pre-Confirmation Milestone

All sixth graders are welcome to join Pastor Heather for a pre-confirmation experience for three Wednesday evening during Lent. We will look at the 5 promises made when we affirm our baptism at Confirmation. These sessions will be interactive opportunities to explore how these promises impact our lives. Mark your calendar for these Wednesdays: February 22, March 1, and March 8th. Class will be from 5:45-6:45pm. A meal will be served for the whole congregation each evening beginning at 5pm. Summer Camp Registration is Here!!



Registration is now open for Lutheran Lakeside Camp this summer. We are planning to attend camp **July 16-21.** There is Junior Camp for those who have completed grades 3-5 and Confirmation Camp for those who have completed grades 6-8. How we will get to camp will be determined at a later date.

Summer Camp drop down menu for more information and the Camp Registration tab when you are ready to register. The total cost for a week at camp is \$475 for the first child. If you send more than one child from your household, there is a \$15 sibling discount for the second and subsequent children. A \$100 deposit is due at registration. There is an Early Bird Discount of \$50 for all those who register by February 28. As in years past, Faith will cover \$150 of the cost of camp per child (including friends that they might invite). Therefore, the out-of-pocket cost, if you register by February 28, would be \$275 for your first child and \$260 for any additional children from your household. Please only pay \$100 at the time of registration and be sure to let them know that you are going with Faith Lutheran Church so that they apply the \$150 campership appropriately. You can pay the remainder of the camp fees after the campership is applied. Also, please let Pastor Carrie know when you have registered so that she can make sure that the campership is applied and have an accurate count of who is planning to go to help with transportation plans.

Adults are invited to join us for the adult mission trip to do work around the camp that week as well, so if that is something that would interest you, please let Pastor Carrie know.
