



Pastor's

Dear Friends in Christ,

This summer has gone so quickly with all of the fun activities that we have experienced throughout the summer. As you look through the pages of this Ambassador, you will find pictures and stories of some of the excitement, and there will be more to come in the September Ambassador as more pictures of our week at camp and the mission trip to Albuquerque will be available.

I write this while I am at camp at Lutheran Lakeside, and I can tell you for certain that this has been a week of learning and growing, having fun and celebrating life. Our theme at camp this week is "God's Wilderness: Caring for Creation," which seems like a natural choice as we have spent this week out in God's beautiful creation. Each day, we had a different aspect of creation to consider: land, animals, water and people. We have considered why it is that God created all that God created. We have talked about the ways that we have hurt God's creation and ways that we can help God's creation so that it can thrive into the future. We have played in God's creation as we moved around camp to canoe on the lakefront, swim in the pool, zip line up high and find our way through the low ropes course, hike on the paths and do some archery, play games in the barn and create crafts in the craft cabin. Worshiped in God's creation, both along the waterfront and in the pool on Wednesday as we considered water and the gift of baptism, especially that God's promises for us are forever, and Jesus promises to always be with us.

The joy of camp is the joy of all of the people here. Watching all of our campers find new skills within themselves, try new things that might have been scary or uncomfortable, like climbing a really tall pole and zip lining off of the platform at the top, make new friends, lead worship, and dare to share their talents and skills in the work that they do and the fun of the end of camp talent show reminds me of all of the ways that God calls us to be God's people and the talents that God gives us that sometimes need a new place in order for them to be uncovered.

God has created all things, and God has called it all good. Sometimes it

can be hard to remember that when we are bombarded with news of all of the ways in which God's creation has been harmed and all the ways that people are hurting each other. Having a week to sit in the midst of that creation and be reminded of God's goodness to us and our calling to be stewards of this creation is a good way to reset in these summer days. It is a good place to be reminded that in our baptism, we have been named and claimed by God. We have been given a new identity as "Beloved Child of God." We are told that God is pleased with us. We are promised that our sins are forgiven, we have the gift of eternal life. We are promised that Jesus will always be with us, and that there is nothing, not one thing on this earth, that can ever separate us from God's love. What better news is there in this world than that? And we have the privilege of sharing that good news with all kinds of other people so that they can know these promises for themselves. These are promises that we all need to hear, and I am so glad that our campers and mission trip volunteers heard these promises over and over again throughout this week at camp. I pray that we can all remember those promises in the year ahead, especially on the days when the hurdles feel high and the struggles are real.

I am also looking forward to this next week as twenty of our youth and five adults head to Albuquerque, New Mexico, for our mission and service learning trip. I know that, again, being in a new place among new people, these youth and adults will learn more about themselves, more about God's people, more about God's promises and how we share in God's work to provide for those in need around us. There will be so many experiences that we will have as we help with a VBS for people with special needs, help at the Food Bank and the Rescue Mission, serve at a clothing pantry and on a farm that works with refugee farmers ease their transition and help them to become selfsufficient in their new land, and work with Habitat for Humanity and with Senior Services. There will also be an opportunity for fun as we explore the city of Albuquerque together. We are grateful for Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Edmond, Oklahoma, which will be our home for one night in each direction, and we look forward to worshiping with them on Sunday morning. I pray that, in the work that we do together, in the fun that we will have along the way, we will see the face of God in one another, in the faces of the people with whom we serve and

those whom we serve. We cannot wait to share our experiences with you.

I want to thank you for all of the ways that you support these opportunities to learn and grow in God's love, to live out our baptismal promises to learn to proclaim Christ through word and deed, to care for others and the world God made, and to work for justice and peace in all the world, and to experience people and places that are different from the places where we live. Please continue to pray for safe travels and joy-filled homecomings, and we hope that you will find ways to engage those who have been on these trips to learn from them about what they have learned, the fun that they have had, the places where they have experienced God's presence.

Blessings on all that remains of this summer time, and I look forward to all that will come as our fall programming begins later in August and in early September!


