Grace-Gifted, Faith-Lifted Called to Share, Seek, and Serve Christ



Dear Siblings in Christ,

This past weekend, we heard these words from Paul to the church in Thessaloniki:

We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Thessalonians 1:2-3)

Paul then goes on to commend God's people in Thessaloniki for the ways in which they serve the people around them even in the face of strife and persecution. Paul mentions how they are imitators of Jesus in all that they do, and he recounts the ways that those around them, the people of Macedonia and Achaia, have been changed by their work and have reported the work that they do in Jesus' name to others as they await Christ's return.

These words from Paul struck home with me as I considered what to say for this month's newsletter. 





Have you considered ACH

There are several ways for members to make their contribution to the church. This article will focus on one of those – ACH (Automated Clearing House). This is a process whereby your bank or credit union can make a transfer directly from your account to the church's account at First Central State Bank. There is a charge of only \$.10 to process this transfer and that is paid by the church so 100% of your contribution goes to the church.

This transfer can be made weekly, monthly or on the 1<sup>st</sup> or 15<sup>th</sup> of the month, whichever you prefer. The transfer can be stopped or changed at any time. And, if you provide your email address, the bank will notify you when the transfer is being made.

It is very straight forward to start or change ACH. Forms are available on the Welcome Station, just outside Pastor Carrie's office, along with an addressed envelope. These can be mailed in or simply dropped off in the office. Please note that your written permission is required to start or change your contribution.

ACH has been used for around 15 years and there have been no issues we are aware of. There are about 50 members using this process.

It is easy to be complacent on the routine transfer and members are encouraged to consider adjusting their ongoing contribution on a regular basis.

Our endowment committee consist of Kim Wilkins, Chairperson; Kenny Oetzmann, Treasurer; Scott Rochau, Recorder/Secretary; Jan Hartwig, Annette Tomlinson, Mike Garner as current Church President, and Pastor Carrie.

We generally meet only once or twice a year to discuss distributing our interest on our endowment funds. Several years ago, we set up the endowment committee and set up a goal of \$50,000. This money was not to be touched. After we reached our \$50,000 goal, it was decided to invest yearly the interest from the endowment fund in 4 separate categories. To date, we have distributed monies to Lutheran Lakeside, Humble Dwellings in Eldridge, to the Southeast Iowa Synod of Iowa, our own church, and others. For example, we gave a total of around \$1,700 to 4 different organizations last year. This year because of additional endowment funds and higher interest rates, Kenny projects we will have

You may ask 'What is an endowment?' By definition, an endowment is an investment account for emergency needs for reserve funds and long-term financial stability.

around \$3,100 to distribute. Our fund has grown to \$102, 543.16.

To do this, we need enough financial stability that we can save for tomorrow instead of just spending for today. We need a mature fund development to include dedicated and passionate supporters and a strong major gifts component.

An endowment is a long-term investment account. It is like a 401K account. Once the money is deposited, you don't touch it but get a distribution from the interest or dividends that accumulate. The endowment provides an annual income stream that should last forever.

To create an endowment, you need 3 things:

- 1. You need "extra" money (after bills etc.) That doesn't mean you reduce your weekly giving to the church to put in an endowment fund.
- 2. You need passionate donors. When you give to an endowment, you are betting on the church in the long-term so it will last forever.
- 3. We need a strong donor program to invest in long-term financial health.
