

Grace-Gifted, Faith-Lifted Called to Share, Seek, and Serve Christ



Dear Friends in Christ,

The Merriam-Webster dictionary defines joy as "a feeling of great pleasure or happiness that comes from success, good fortune, or a sense of well-being: gladness." However, in my experience, joy is something more. As I was trying to put my finger on how to explain joy as I know it, I came across a discussion of the difference between happiness and joy on the Compassion International website. They write:

The difference between joy and happiness lives in the mind and the heart.

- Joy is in the heart. Happiness is on the face.
- Joy is of the soul. Happiness is of the moment.
- Joy transcends. Happiness reacts.
- Joy embraces peace and contentment waiting to be discovered.
- Joy runs deep and overflows, while happiness hugs hello.
- Joy is a practice and a behavior. It's deliberate and intentional. Happiness comes and goes blithely along its way.
- Joy is profound and Scriptural. "Don't worry, rejoice" (Philippians 4:4-6). Happiness is a balm. "Don't worry, be happy."
- Joy is an inner feeling. Happiness is an outward expression.
- Joy endures hardship and trials and connects with meaning and purpose.
- A person pursues happiness but chooses joy.

While happiness and jubilation and exhilaration are emotions that may be present with joy and may even be expressions of joy, they do not define joy. Instead, in its purest form, joy transforms difficult times into blessings and turn heartache into gratitude. Joy is that which brings meaning to life. Joy brings life to life.

Perhaps that is why joy is considered one of the fruits of the Spirit: "[T]he fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control" (Galatians 5:22-23a). When we find joy, there is a sense of comfort and peace not only when things are going well, but also when things feel like they are upside-down. Joy provides grounding that is born out of the hope that God is the one in control of our lives.

I firmly believe that joy resides deeply within each one of us and that God has put the seed of joy into each of God's beloved children. However, sometimes, we have a hard time tapping into that joy, especially when things are not going as we had hoped and when happiness is not the emotion that is on our face. Sometimes, it can be hard to tap into that joy and live in the hope of life in Christ.

Therefore, during the season of Lent, we will take some time to peel back the layers of nuance that allow joy to adapt to different life circumstances. We will seek out the seed of joy that can ground us in God's love and hope for each of our lives.

Throughout the season, we will use the lectionary texts each weekend to reflect on different aspects of joy. On Wednesday evenings, we will gather for Evening Prayer, and together, we will experience various practices of prayer to help us to center us in the joy that is within us. Finally, a daily devotion will be available for you to use during the week that will invite you to journal and use the traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, although not in the traditional ways, as practices of joy. More details about our midweek worship and devotions can be found on page 5.

I pray that our Lenten journey will lead us beyond happiness into the joy of Christ that is within us. I pray that during this more solemn period of the church year, we will indeed find the seed of joy that will lead us to the joy of Easter and the hope and promise of life in Christ, now and forever. Join us as we journey together.

Midweek Lenten Worship



Lent can be a somber season of the church year. It begins with an ashen sign of mortality and sin. Bright colors turn to deep purples, alleluias fall silent, and we ponder what to give up this year. Easter, on the other hand, is obviously joyful. Bells ring,

alleluias echo, white and gold shine brightly, and every single candle is lit. Jesus is risen, and so are the daffodils, hyacinths, and lilacs. Joy clearly belongs to Easter.

Why reflect on joy during the quiet introspection of Lent instead of waiting for Easter? A joyful Lent is not an oxymoron. As it turns out, joy is right at home during a minor-key season like Lent—and if joy is there, perhaps there are other seasons of life that joy calls home, too. Joy is a beacon that points us toward God's unfailing presence, even in the heart of fear and pain.

During the season of Lent, we will explore how joy is planted, tended, nurtured and nourished by God and God's people through the scripture readings assigned for each week. Each Wednesday, during our Lenten Evening Prayer Service, we will use Holden Evening Prayer and will respond to readings from the previous Sunday using a different devotional practice to help provide fertile ground to explore the seed of joy. The theme and practice for each week will be:

Ash Wednesday: Setting the Stage for Joy—Imposition of Ashes

Week 1: Persistent Joy—Lectio Divina
Week 2: Expectant Joy—Honest Prayers
Week 3: Liberating Joy—Embodied Prayer
Week 4: Transformative Joy—Praying the N

Week 4: Transformative Joy—Praying the News

Week 5: Vocational Joy—Vocational Prayer

Holy Week will focus on "Joy Everywhere and Nowhere," and Easter will finally erupt in "Glorious Joy."

There will also be an accompanying daily devotion guide that will guide us through the covenants of God as we explore scripture's lead to explore the different textures and colors of joy each week. With the exception of the brief half-week at the beginning of the season, each week's devotions are structured by the regular practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving using a journal or through reflection or conversation, whatever works best for you and your life. Sundays will reflect on the scripture. Mondays will invite you the practice a kind of prayer to connect to a specific aspect of joy. Tuesdays will provide a prompt for journaling that suggests how you might ask for God's help. Wednesdays provide a suggestion for a fast, not from food, but to help you focus on what you already have rather than what you have given up. Thursdays return to the journal with prompts for how to direct thanksgiving to God. Fridays invite you to respond to God's work in your life by giving time, talent or treasure in a way that honors the week's exploration of joy. Saturdays invite you to connect with creation to learn how to "tell forth the glory of God" (Psalm 19:1).

We hope that you will join us on this Lenten journey as we seek that God-given



camp will be determined at a later date.

information and the Camp Registration tab when you are ready to register. The total cost for a week at camp is \$480 for the first child. If you send more than one child from your household, there is a \$15 sibling discount for the second and subsequent children. A \$100 deposit is due at registration. There is an Early Bird Discount of \$50 for all those who register by February 28. As in years past, Faith will cover \$150 of the cost of camp per child (including friends that they might invite). Therefore, the out-of-pocket cost, if you register by February 28, would be \$280 for your first child and \$265 for any additional children from your household. Please only pay \$100 at the time of registration and be sure to let them know that you are going with Faith Lutheran Church so that they apply the \$150 campership appropriately. You can pay the remainder of the camp fees after the campership is applied. Also, please let Pastor Carrie know when you have registered so that she can make sure that the campership is applied and have an accurate count of who is planning to go to help with transportation plans.

Adults are invited to join us for the adult mission trip to do work around the camp that week as well, so if that is something that would interest you, please let Pastor Carrie know.
